Reporting officer was dispatched to 33 Plymouth Street on a report of a non-responsive female. Medics and fire were dispatched as well.

Upon arrival, a knock on the door was answered by a frantic man, later identified as [REDACTED]. He directed me to the rear of the apartment to a bedroom. There I observed a young adult black female laying on her back, on the floor. She had dried blood in and around her right nostril. She did not appear to be breathing. He told me that the person on the phone (EOS call taker) instructed him to do chest compressions. He picked up his phone and asked if he should keep doing them. He was trembling and visibly shaken. The call taker told him to hang up and speak with me. I told him the medics were on the way and the sirens could be heard in the distance.

I asked what her name was, and he replied "Lauren". When asked for her last name he said he wasn't sure, but her Instagram page says

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it is "Smith". He stated that he has only known her for three days and came here for the first-time last night. They met on the dating site "Bumble". Fire and medics arrived on scene and began life saving efforts for "Lauren"

When asked, ~~██████████~~ stated that after meeting on Bumble, he found out that they had a mutual friend via Instagram, and they began to chat there. She invited him over for a date asking him to give her \$40.00 to get her nails done and to bring a bottle of tequila. He said he arrived at her home at approximately 2130 hours and tried to contact her via an Instagram call twice, but she did not answer. He said that he does not have any direct contact information for her (cell phone number, etc.) and only ever contacts her via Instagram. Thinking he was stood up, he left. But Lauren called him to come back a short time late saying that she didn't answer his call because she was putting on her make up.

He went on to say that they began drinking shots of tequila and Lauren became ill. She went to the bathroom to vomit and was apologetic when she returned. They then decided to drink the tequila with mixers. They played some games, ate some food, and started to watch a movie. Lauren was texting with someone and then told him that her brother was going to be dropping something off to her. She went outside for a few minutes (he never saw the brother). When she came back in, she went straight to the bathroom and she stayed in there for approximately 10-15 minutes. He thought it was odd, but didn't feel it was his place to say anything as he didn't know her that well.

They continued to watch the movie and finished the bottle of tequila (Casamigos Tequila 750 ml). Lauren fell asleep on the couch. So,

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he carried her to her bedroom and laid her in her bed. He then laid down next to her and fell asleep. He woke up at approximately 0300 hours to use the bathroom and Lauren was snoring. He woke up again at approximately 0630 hours and she was laying on her right side, blood was coming out of her right nostril onto the bed, and she was not breathing. That is when he called 911.

AMR medic #3038 (Truck 715) pronounced her dead at 0649 hours. He told me that she has been dead at least an hour or more.

[REDACTED] gave a written field statement as to his account of the events of the evening.

I notified Sgt. DeBarros and request the detective bureau supervisor be notified via dispatch. Sgt. DeBarros arrived shortly thereafter.

I contacted stated medical examiner Jaclyn Meserole at 0704 hours. (ME Case #21-25709)

I found a US passport identifying Lauren as Ms. Lauren Smith-Fields, mail with the same name, a mastercard with that name, and \$1,345.00 in cash. There was a cell phone on the couch that **[REDACTED]** identified as Ms. Smith-Fields' phone. There was also some mail to Ms. Stephanie Green and Mr. Brian Green.

Det. Sgt. Morales and Det. Cronin arrived on scene at 0812 hours. The medical examiner arrived on scene shortly thereafter.

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I made contact with Mr. Hector Torres. He is the landlord and lives on the second floor. He said the Ms. Smith-Fields has lived there for almost a year. He knows that her mother stops by occasionally, but he does not know her and has no contact information for her. He was issued a complaint service form and asked to give it to Ms. Smith-Fields mother the next time he sees her. Det. Cronin gave Mr. Torres his contact information before he and Det Sgt, Morales left the scene.

The medical examiner informed me that a trade service would be coming to retrieve the body before she left the scene.

Mr. Joel Randolph of Nutmeg Trade Service arrived on scene at 0933 hours. He completed State of Connecticut Officer of the Chief Medical Examiner Removal Authorization form (ME-12 REV 10/18) and left white copy with me.

After the body was removed, I located a key that fit the front door lock. I made sure all windows and doors were secure and all lights were off and locked both locks on the front door when I left.

Ms. Smith-Fields money, key, passport, mastercard, and cellphone were all turned in to the property room for safekeeping/further investigation.

The written field statement and the Removal Authorization form were turned in to the record room and copies of these forms are attached to this report.

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
